EDUCATION

Gateway School expanded to middle school, launched a new curriculum individually tailored to student needs, and amended the school calendar to provide year-round educational programming. Donor support allowed us to invest in critical technology upgrades in each classroom.

HEARING HEALTH

More than 250 hearing aids were provided to older adults, many at a reduced rate. These devices will improve patient health outcomes to clients as they age and ensure that they can stay connected to their community and family.

INCLUSION

Nearly 1,000 people from community groups, classrooms, churches, and companies gained the skills to improve the customer experience for those who are deaf, hard of hearing, or have a sensory difference through HASA's customized inclusion and Deaf awareness workshops.

LANGUAGE ACCESS

A new partnership between HASA and the Baltimore Office of Promotion and the Arts (BOPA) has created an opportunity for both Artscape and Brilliant Baltimore to have interpreted performances for the Deaf, a dedicated HASA Hush Zone for those with sensory needs, and a special Silent Disco installation at each event.

SPEECH & LANGUAGE

HASA celebrated more than 30 years of partnership with the RiteCare Childhood Speech and Language Center. The Scottish Rite Foundation, who helps fund HASA's therapeutic services, is the longest-tenured donor in HASA's 94-year history.
